

USDA research is working for Florida

Supporting innovation

In FY 2015, Florida received **\$7.3 million in new grants** from the Agriculture and Food Research Initiative (AFRI).

Corn yield is known to be adversely affected by high temperatures. AFRI-funded researchers are working to identify the steps in corn kernel development that are most susceptible to heat as a way to develop more heat-tolerant corn varieties.

AFRI funding at the **University of Florida** is being used to develop, optimize and disseminate management practices to enable southern pine landowners to mitigate atmospheric CO_2 , more efficiently utilize fertilizer inputs and increase resilience in the face of changing climate.

Supporting small business

From 2006-2015, Florida small businesses received more than **\$3.3 million in grants** through the Small Business Innovation Research program within USDA

In Gainesville, **Geo-Spider Inc.** is using an SBIR grant to develop a proto-type harvesting device that will increase harvesting efficiency and speed in high-density citrus groves.

Economic Impact



In 2014, agriculture and related industries added **\$985 billion** to the U.S. gross domestic product (GDP).



Agriculture exports hit a record high of **\$150 billion**, or 9% of total U.S. exports, in 2014.



In 2014, 17.3 million full- and part-time jobs were related to agriculture – **about** 9.3% of total U.S. employment.



U.S. public investments in agriculture research and development produce **benefit-cost ratios of 20:1 and higher**
